STAT. §17-568.01 FOR THE IMMEDIATE REPAIR OF ENGINE #5 AT THE FALLS CITY POWER PLANT, WAIVING THE ESTIMATE OF COST AND ADVERTISING FOR BIDS AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO SUCH CONTRACT IMMEDIATELY UPON PASSAGE AND POSTING OF THIS EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AS PROVIDED BY NEB. REV. STAT. §17-613.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FALLS CITY NEBRASKA:

Section 1. On September 28, 2021, a crankshaft explosion occurred in Engine #5 at the Falls City Power Plant. This engine is highly relied upon to provide power necessary to meet the load demands of the community.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Council of the City of Falls City hereby declare that a public emergency exists pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §17-568.01(6) resulting from an exigency or pressing necessity or unforseen need calling for immediate action or remedy to prevent a serious loss of, or serious injury or damage to life, health or property.

Section 3. As a result of the public emergency the Mayor and City Council of the City of Falls City hereby waive the estimate of cost and advertising of bids for the repair of Engine #5 at the Falls City Power Plant.

Section 4. The Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract for such repairs to Engine #5 with FMI in the amount of \$313,796.20.

Section 5. Any ordinance in conflict herewith is hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by 3/4 of the City Council and posting of a proclamation of the Mayor as provided by Neb. Rev. Stat. §17-613.

SCOPE/INTENT AND EXTENT OF SERVICES: Whereas, the CITY desires to employ the ENGINEER to perform the following:

Phase 1 - Design / Bidding Services

- 1. Preparation of Drawings and Specifications for relocation of 20 LF of water main by the Preston Bridge.
- 2. Submit Specifications to NDEE for regulatory review and approval concurrently with Bidding Process.
- Distribute Bidding Documents to prospective bidders, conduct bid opening and make recommendation for award.
- 4. Coordinate with BNSF during pre-design, and pipeline location.

Phase 2 - Construction Phase Services

- 1. Prepare construction contracts between Owner and Contractor.
- 2. Conducting preconstruction conference
- 3. One-site construction observation services
- 4. Preparation of As-Recorded Drawings and submission as required by NDEE-Public Water Section

EXCLUDED SERVICES:

- 1. Review Pee required by NDEE-Public Water Section will be paid by the City.
- 2. Legal Survey, for acquisition or easements
- 3. BNSF or any other project permitting fees

FEE ARRANGEMENT: Phase 1 services will be invoiced for a lump sum fee of \$59,300. Phase 2 services (if desired by the City) will be invoiced on an hourly basis, not to exceed an estimated \$41,700, based on a 75-day construction period. For the purposes of this Agreement, the hourly rates are as follows:

Terms and Conditions

The firm shall perform the services outlined in this agreement for the stated fee arrangement.

Access To Site: Unless otherwise stated, the ENGINEER will have access to the site for activities necessary for the performance of the services. The ENGINEER will take precautions to minimize damages due to these activities, but the cost of restoration of any resulting damage has not been included in the fee.

Dispute Resolution: Any claims or disputes made during design, construction or post-construction between the CITY and ENGINEER shall be submitted to non-binding mediation. CITY and ENGINEER agree to include a similar mediation agreement with all contractors, subcontractors, subconsultants, supplies and fabricators, thereby providing for mediation as the primary method for dispute resolution between all parties.

Billing/Payment: Invoices for the ENGINEER's services shall be submitted, at the ENGINEER's option, either between completion of such services or on a monthly basis. Invoices shall be payable within 30 days after the invoice date. If the invoice is not paid within 30 days, the ENGINEER may, without waiving any claim or right against the CITY, and without liability whatsoever to the CITY, terminate the performance of the service. Retainers shall be credited on the final invoice.

Late Payments: Accounts unpaid 60 days after the invoice date may be subject to a monthly service charge of 1.5% (or the legal rate) on the then unpaid balance. In the event any portion or all of an account remains unpaid 90 days after the billing, the CITY shall pay all costs of collection, including reasonable attorney's fees.

Indemnification: The CITY shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, indemnify and hold harmless the ENGINEER, his or her officers, directors, employees, agents and subconsultants from and against all damage, liability and cost, including reasonable attorney's fees and defense costs, arising out of or in any way connected with the performance by any of the parties above named of the services under this agreement, excepting only those damages, liabilities or costs attributable to the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the ENGINEER.

Certifications: Guarantees and Warranties: The ENGINEER shall not be required to execute any document that would result in its certifying, guaranteeing or warranting the existence of conditions whose existence the ENGINEER cannot ascertain.


Defects in Service: The CITY shall provide prompt written notice to the ENGINEER if the CITY becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Project, including any errors, omissions or inconsistencies in the ENGINEER's instruments of service.

Limitation of Liability: In recognition of the relative risks, rewards and benefits of the project to both the CITY and the ENGINEER, the risks have been allocated such that the CITY agrees that, to the fullest extent permitted by law, the ENGINEER's total liability to the CITY for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, damages or claim expenses arising out of this agreement from any cause or causes, shall not exceed the fee. Such cause may include, but are not limited to, the ENGINEER's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or breach of warranty.

Consequential Damages: In no event will ENGINEER, ENGINEER's affiliated corporations, officers, employees, or subcontractors be liable for special, indirect, or consequential damages, and in order to protect ENGINEER against indirect liability or third-party proceedings, CITY will indemnify ENGINEER for any such loss or damage.

Termination of Services: This agreement may be terminated by the CITY or the ENGINEER should the other fail to perform its obligations hereunder. In the event of termination, the CITY shall pay the ENGINEER for all services rendered to the date of termination, and all reimbursable expenses.

Ownership of Documents: All documents produced by the ENGINEER under this agreement shall remain the property of the ENGINEER and may not be used by the CITY for any other endeavor without the written consent of the ENGINEER.
