To the Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council,

"We, Carla and Vincent Behrens, residents of 924 Morton Street, Falls City, NE, are writing to formally object to the proposed parking ban on the east side of Morton Street between 9th street east 182 feet, initiated by Mr. Bing. This objection is shared by several other neighboring residents on the east side of Morton Street."

We have lived on this street for four years and have not experienced any parking issues until the past two years, when Mr. Bing began raising concerns related to the placement of his trailer parking pad. It is important to note that Mr. Bing has multiple alternative locations available for parking his vehicles and trailers. Despite owning additional property on the block, he chose to place his parking pad directly across from our neighbor's home, which has caused controversy. Many residents, including ourselves, do not have driveways and rely solely on on-street parking in front of our homes.

Additionally, our street is frequently used for public parking during events at the nearby park. We have never encountered issues with others parking in front of our homes, as we understand this is shared community space. If Mr. Bing had concerns about accessing his trailers, he could have addressed this by knocking on our doors—a gesture we have previously encouraged—or requested a temporary arrangement. Instead, he has repeatedly contacted authorities to have our vehicles marked and has now sought a city-implemented parking ban without engaging directly with the impacted residents, and without providing any formal notification that a motion was being made to change street use.

Additionally, we must point out a critical logistical flaw in the proposed restricted area. The specific stretch of the east side of Morton Street—extending 182 feet north from 9th Street—contains two active mailboxes serving multiple households. Implementing a "no parking" zone here would either prevent the U.S. Postal Service from safely and efficiently delivering mail to these residents, or it would require the postal carrier to violate the proposed city ordinance simply to perform their essential federal duty. This demonstrates that the ban, as currently drawn, is impractical and in conflict with necessary public access.

This proposed ban would impose significant and unfair hardship on us and other residents, as we have no reasonable alternatives for parking. The issue, in our view, stems solely from Mr. Bing's choice of location for his parking pad, not from any misconduct by the neighborhood.

Given that Mr. Bing has not attempted to discuss his concerns with us, has not informed us of his intention to petition for a parking ban, and has other viable options for trailer placement, we respectfully request that the City Council **not approve the proposed parking ban** on the east side of Morton Street.

We believe this proposed ban would create unnecessary hardship for multiple households and appears to serve only the personal convenience of a single individual, not the broader community interest.

Should the Council seek a long-term solution that addresses both community parking needs and individual concerns, we propose exploring the possibility of granting permanent off-street parking access to the impacted residents. Implementing a **permeable grass paved system** for such driveways would mitigate water runoff and maintain a beautiful aesthetic in line with the nearby park's atmosphere.

Esteemed Members of the City Council,

We, the concerned residents of Morton Street, including the households at **916 Morton Street** (Kala Moore, Anthony Moore) and **902 Morton Street**, as well as other affected residents such as **Maddison Lyons-Brown, Carla Behrens, and Vince Behrens**, are writing to formally and strongly oppose the proposed approval of the **182-foot parking restriction** on our street.

We did not even realize there was a rezoning. There was no sign post for a rezoning.

We understand that this parking proposal is intended to accommodate a single property owner ("Bing"). However, this restriction would impose a severe and unjust personal and financial inconvenience upon multiple families who rely on existing street parking.

The Impact on Residents

- 1. **Elimination of Legal Parking Spaces:** The property owner has created multiple driveways across their extensive lot. We were advised by Officer Tim Daniels that vehicles must be parked at least 15 feet away from driveways. When this regulation is applied between the property owner's numerous driveways, it effectively **eliminates nearly all remaining legal street parking** on both the east and west sides of Morton Street for multiple residences.
- 2. Unfair Burden for Personal Choice: The property owner chose to develop a massive, blocklong lot with multiple access points (driveways/pads), which now necessitates an unreasonable restriction of public parking to accommodate the movement of their personal trailers. We respectfully maintain that one man's personal choice in property development should not become a community problem that negatively impacts the rights and use of public space by long-term residents.
- 3. Community Character: We purchased our homes with the understanding that on-street parking was a permanent, necessary feature of this neighborhood. We are located near the park and ball field, and we accept the temporary inconvenience of ball game parking without complaint, as we bought our houses with that context. To suddenly change the established precedent for the benefit of one individual undermines the community nature of this street.

Public Safety Concerns and Damages

The City Council must also consider the significant cafety implications of forcing residents onto a single, high-risk parking side:

- **Vandalism and Damage:** Parking on the west side of Morton Street consistently results in vehicle damage. In recent instances:
 - Following a visit from Officer Daniels, one vehicle was moved to the west side and both
 driver and passenger side tires were punctured with screws the very next day.

- A white 15-passenger van was struck on consecutive nights, leading to a **shattered driver-side mirror**.
- In 2022, a highly customized Chrysler 300 was hit and totaled, resulting in a substantial financial loss that was not fully covered by insurance due to upgraded parts.

The west side of the street is a known hazard zone. Approving this restriction will force multiple families to park in this area, increasing the likelihood of damage, vandalism, and financial hardship for the affected residents.

We urge the City Council to recognize that this proposed restriction would only benefit one property owner who made personal choices regarding the development of their large property, while imposing profound inconvenience, financial risk, and parking hardship on multiple families who own smaller properties and rely solely on the public street for parking.

We respectfully request that you **DO NOT APPROVE** the 182-foot parking restriction on Morton Street.

Dear City Administrator Nussbaum:

Pursuant to your request, I have reviewed the issue regarding the motion passed at the Special Meeting of the City Council on November 19, 2025. Based upon your email, my review of the YouTube video of the meeting and my conversation with Councilman Ferguson, it is my understanding that when the motion was made it referred to the salary package which was presented at the November 3, 2025 City Council meeting. That the motion as discussed was regarding the resolution as presented at the November 17, 2025 meeting. That the vote was taken based on the motion made and that most, if not all members, including Councilman Ferguson, who made the motion believed they were voting to approve the version presented at the November 17, 2025 meeting.

While I appreciate your attempt to clarifity the matter in the draft minutes, it is my legal opinion that as adopted the resolution is for the November 3 version of the resolution setting the wages at the higher level.

In order to correct this action, it is my legal opinion that two members of the Council who voted in favor of the resolution need to request the rescinding of the motion be placed on the City Council agenda for the next meeting. If this happens then the agenda item should read: "Discussion & Action - To reconsider resolution regarding non-union wage scales and benefits for fiscal year 2026, 2027 and 2028 passed at the November 19th special meeting."

If the Council wishes to change what was adopted two members who voted for the resolution need to move and second the reconsideration of the resolution. If that motion is made and passes then the council moves on to the next agenda item. If the matter is not placed on the agenda or not passed then in my legal opinion the wages would be as set in the material presented at the November 3rd meeting.

The next agenda item would be "Discussion & Action – Resolution considering non-union wage scales and benefits for Fiscal Year 2026, 2027 & 2028."

To adopt the resolution which the parties thought was being acted upon last meeting the motion made should state "I move to rescind the resolution regarding non-union wage scales and benefits for Fiscal Year 2026, 2027 & 2028 passed at the special meeting of the City Council on November 19, 2025 and that the resolution first presented to the City Council at the November 17 meeting, and contained in the agenda packet emailed on November 15, as recommended by the committee be adopted."

If passed this will both rescind the prior resolution and set out the new wages as I understand were intended.

Alternatively a motion to rescind the prior action could be made with some other proposal regarding wages made as long as all the terms of that resolution were clear.

A motion to rescind the prior action made alone and if passed then further motions to be made or the matter tabled to a future meeting regarding the setting of the non-union wage scale.

APPROVING NON-UNION WAGE SCALES AND BENEFIT ADJUSTMENTS EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 12, 2025

Whereas, the City of Falls City, NE, has completed a comprehensive restructuring of city operations to improve efficiency, accountability, and organizational alignment; and

Whereas, the City previously adopted new wage scales for union employees effective October 12, 2025, to ensure competitive compensation consistent with other comparable municipalities and industry standards; and

Whereas, the Board of Public Works has reviewed and formally adopted recommended wage scales for the Water and Light Commissioner as authorized by City Code; and

Whereas, the Non-Union/Management Negotiation Committee previously met on October 29, 2025, to review proposed wage scales, benefit adjustments, and supporting data, and recommended approval of the same to the City Council on November 3, 2025; and

Whereas, the resolution presented on November 3, 2025, did not pass, and the City Council provided no recommendations nor referred the matter back to committee at that time; and

Whereas, the Mayor subsequently reorganized the Non-Union/Management Negotiation Committee, removing members who had not actively participated in committee meetings and appointing new members to further review and evaluate the proposed wage scales and benefits plan; and

Whereas, the newly appointed Non-Union/Management Negotiation Committee met on November 10, 2025, and, following its review and deliberation of comparative data of similar cities with similar operations, has unanimously recommended proposed wages and wage scales for non-union employees to ensure consistency and equity across all employee groups; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of the City to establish competitive and equitable compensation and benefits for management personnel in order to attract and retain qualified employees and ensure operational continuity across all departments;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Falls City, NE, that:

- The updated Non-Union Wage Scales and Benefits Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit A, are hereby approved and adopted, effective October 12, 2025, to align with the implementation date of all other citywide wage adjustments.
- 2. The wage ranges and individual placement recommendations outlined in Exhibit A shall serve as the official pay plan for all designated non-union positions.

BENEFITS (APPLY TO ONLY FULLTIME EMPLOYEES)

CAFETERIA PLAN

The City shall maintain a plan under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code to allow employees to choose certain benefits to be paid from pre-tax payroll deductions. Employees who have signed up for a high deductible health insurance plan are not eligible for a flexible health spending account under a cafeteria plan.

HEALTH INSURANCE

The City of Falls City shall maintain a group health insurance policy on the employees of the City of Falls City, which policy shall include a dependent policy option for all full-time City employees. The City shall pay 100% of the single premium cost for each employee of the City or in the event an employee selects employee/spouse, employee/child or the family policy option, the City shall then pay 85% of the elected option premium cost for said employee of the City and the employee shall then pay 15% of the elected option premium cost. Any sum due from the employee herein shall be paid by the City deducting such payment from his or her pay check to pay for such coverage.

Employees who have health insurance through a spouse or from other sources, once verified can opt to take in lieu of benefit payments of five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) monthly. This amount shall be added to the employee's pay check. An employee who is married to another City employee and covered on the spouse's policy is not eligible for in lieu of benefits. Employees shall have the ability to choose between a traditional plan or a qualified high deductible plan. The City may self-insure and purchase higher deductible plans by reimbursing the deductible down on the traditional or high deductible plan to the agreed upon deductibles. The deductible for both plans will be determined annually through the recommendation of the insurance committee, with approval by the City Council.

The City shall fund the employee's HSA/HRA for those who have selected the high deductible medical plans including administrative fees for active employees. This funding shall be placed in an HSA/HRA account in the employee's name. The funding level shall be determined annually through the recommendation of the insurance committee, with approval of the City Council. The City shall contribute to each eligible employee's Health Savings Account (HSA) on a per-pay-period basis, with contributions made during each of the 26 regular payroll periods throughout the calendar year. The annual City contribution shall be divided evenly across those pay periods.

GROUP LIFE INSURANCE

The City of Falls City shall obtain a \$20,000 group term life insurance contract with accidental death and disability for each of the full-time supervisory employees covered by this Agreement and shall pay the premiums for such policy. Employees may purchase additional group term life insurance at their costs as allowed by the insurer.

GROUP DISABILITY INSURANCE

Employees may obtain a group disability insurance policy to be used by all City employees. Such policies shall be at employee's cost. Employees recognize that such group insurance is only available if a qualified number of employees agree to subscribe.

GROUP DENTAL AND VISION INSURANCE

Employees may obtain a group dental and vision insurance policy to be used by all City employees. Such policies shall be at employee's cost. Employees recognize that such group insurance is only available if a qualified number of employees agree to subscribe.

PENSION

All full-time employees will be covered by a retirement plan. Full-time employees must participate in the plan as long as they are employees of the City. Employee contributions shall be 7% of gross pay. City's contribution shall be 7% of each employee's gross pay. Management staff that are also appointed officials shall be fully vested in the Pension Plan immediately upon participation while all other full-time employees shall be fully vested in the Pension Plan 20% after one (1) year, 40% after two (2) years, 60% after three (3) years, 80% after four (4) years and 100% after five (5) years of employment.

VACATION

All full-time employees of the City who have been in the employment of the City continuously for twelve (12) months shall be eligible for vacation leave with pay. Authorized leave shall be computed on the following basis:

Upon completion of one year continuous service – 6 days vacation Upon completion of two years continuous service – 10 days vacation Upon completion of four years continuous service – 11 days vacation Upon completion of five years continuous service – 12 days vacation Upon completion of five years continuous service – 13 days vacation Upon completion of six years continuous service – 14 days vacation Upon completion of eight years continuous service – 15 days vacation Upon completion of ten years continuous service – 16 days vacation Upon completion of 12 years continuous service – 17 days vacation Upon completion of 14 years continuous service – 18 days vacation Upon completion of 16 years continuous service – 19 days vacation Upon completion of 17 years continuous service – 20 days vacation Upon completion of 20 years continuous service – 22 days vacation Upon completion of 25 years continuous service – 25 days vacation Upon completion of 25 years continuous service – 25 days vacation

Vacation shall be taken within one (1) year from the date received each year, however, prior to the one (1) year anniversary vacation date, any employee may carry over no more than two (2) weeks into the following year, at which time the total vacation must be taken within six (6) months thereafter or said carryover vacation will be paid to the employee within thirty (30) days of the 6-month deadline. If an employee has had an extended illness with an extended recovery time in excess of a 30-day period and at least fifteen (15) days prior to the anniversary vacation date; then more than two (2) weeks of vacation time may be carried over if approved by the City Administrator. If scheduling carryover vacation is not feasible, employee will be paid in lieu.

Fulltime employees in good standing with the City and after giving the proper two (2) weeks notice of termination of employment, will receive all accrued vacation time. Any vacation pay (including unused vacation hours) or other pay, other than regular salary, will be paid as severance pay, with the employee receiving, a check including severance pay and regular pay. Any employee may donate a portion of his/her vacation to another employee who has used all of their own leave due to a serious illness if approved by the City Administrator.

COMMUNITY SERVICE LEAVE

Supervisory employees shall receive paid time off to give blood at the bloodmobile in Falls City, Nebraska. Such time off must be scheduled through the employee's supervisor. Employees whom are members of the Volunteer Ambulance Squad or Fire Departments shall be granted paid time off to respond to emergency calls.

SICK LEAVE

Sick leave shall be limited to employee's house confining sickness or medical attention or examination. Sick leave shall be for employees only, except when an employee's dependent living in the employee's personal residence, the employee's parents, spouse, or children (including foster children or children for which the employee is the legal guardian), twenty-six (26) years of age or under, has a medical illness that would mandate hospitalization or medical treatment. The employee must provide a written Certificate by a licensed physician to the office of the City Clerk. Any employee that claims any absence against his or her sick leave shall be required to furnish, in writing, a doctor's certificate of illness, when the employee is absent in excess of three (3) days or when required to do so by the City Administrator. Said proof will be on file at the office of the City Clerk for any absence charged against his or her sick leave. For each month employed, eight (8) hours of sick leave shall be earned. Sick leave can be accumulative up to 960 hours. Full time employees shall receive compensation for the employee's total accumulated sick leave when the employee leaves employment with the City in good standing at a rate of 50% or a rate of 100% after 5 years of continued service. Full time employees that are also appointed officials shall receive compensation for the employee's total accumulated sick leave when the employee leaves employment with the City in good standing at a rate of 100%.

BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

When there is a death or death appears imminent (as prescribed by a medical doctor) of an employee's mother, father, step-mother, step-father, spouse, children, step-children, and a minor individual for whom the employee has assumed the legal rights, duties and responsibilities of a parent, the employee will be granted paid bereavement leave not to exceed five (5) working days.

Where there is a death or death appears imminent (as prescribed by a medical doctor) of an employee's grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother, half-sister, current mother-in-law, current father-in-law, current daughter-in-law, current son-in-law, current brother-in-law, and current sister-in-law an employee will be granted paid bereavement leave not to exceed three (3) working days.

Where there is a death or death appears imminent (as prescribed by a medical doctor) of an employee's uncle, aunt, niece or nephew (including step-relations of the same), an employee will be granted paid bereavement leave not to exceed one (1) working day.

PALLBEARER OR HONOR GUARD LEAVE

If a full-time City employee has been asked to be a pallbearer, Military Honor Guard, Police Honor Guard, or Firemen Honor Guard and requests time off for that purpose, the employee will be granted a maximum of four (4) hours off with pay. Time taken off as a pallbearer or Honor Guard shall be shown on the employee's time card as Pallbearer Leave or Honor Guard Leave.

JURY DUTY

Any employee who is summoned to serve on jury duty shall not be subject to discharge from employment, loss of pay, loss of sick leave, loss of vacation time, or any other form of penalty as a result of his or her absence from employment due to such jury duty upon giving reasonable notice to his or her supervisor of such summons. Any employee who is summoned to serve on jury duty shall be excused upon request from any shift work for those days required to serve as a juror without loss of pay. The City may reduce the pay of an employee by an amount equal to any compensation, other than expenses, paid by the court for jury duty.

MILITARY LEAVE

All employees who are members of the National Guard, Army Reserve, Naval Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, Air Force Reserve, and Coast Guard Reserve, shall be entitled to a military leave of absence from their respective duties, without loss of pay, when employed with or without pay under the orders or authorization of competent authority in the active service of the state or of the United States. Members who normally work or are normally scheduled to work 159 hours or more in three consecutive weeks and scheduled to work 24-hour shifts shall receive a military leave of absence of 168 hours each calendar year. Members who normally work or are normally scheduled to work 120 hours or more but less than 159 hours in three consecutive weeks shall receive a military leave of absence of 120 hours in three consecutive weeks shall receive a military leave of absence each calendar year equal to the number of hours they normally work or would normally be scheduled to work, whichever is greater, in three consecutive weeks. Such military leave of absence may be taken in hourly increments and shall be in addition to the regular annual leave of the persons named in this Article.

When the Governor of this state declares that a state of emergency exists and any of the persons named in this Article are ordered to active service of the state, a state of emergency leave of absence will be granted until such member is released from active service of the state by competent authority. A military leave of absence shall not be used during a state of emergency declared by the Governor. Other forms of leave may be granted. During a state of emergency leave of absence because of the call of the Governor, any employee subject to this Article shall receive his or her normal salary or compensation minus the state active-duty base pay he or she receives in active service of the state.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Employees may request authorized time off without pay after available benefits have been completely used. Regular employees may make application for any leave of absence to the Mayor and City Council for appropriate action. Only the City Council may grant leaves of absence except in the case of an emergency the Mayor or City Administrator may grant a temporary leave of absence upon the recommendation from the Department Head.

MATERNITY LEAVE

An employee physically disabled from performing work due to pregnancy, maternity, or childbirth shall have the same sick pay and sick leave privileges as described above, provided the employee continues to work and returns to work as soon as the employee is physically able to work. If the employee elects for personal wishes,

convenience, or other reasons to begin or end the leave from work at any other time unrelated to physical capacity to perform work, then the absence will be treated as a leave of absence without pay. This section concerning maternity leave will be applied in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws.

FAMILY LEAVE ACTS

Eligible employees have the rights given them to time off without pay by the Federal and State Family Leave Acts but are required to use paid leave first as provided by the acts as part of the allowed time off. The 12-month FMLA period will be the 12-month period measured backward from the date the employee uses any FMLA leave. Employee shall provide at least thirty (30) days' advance notice if the leave is foreseeable based on an expected birth, adoption, or foster care placement, or planned medical treatment for a serious health condition. All other notice must be provided as soon as practicable. Notice must be provided by the employee and in person when possible. If employees request leave for a serious health condition (for self or family member), they shall provide a medical certification issued by a health care provider. The certification shall include the date a serious health condition commenced, its probable duration, and an explanation of the condition. Employees must continue to pay their share of health insurance premium during unpaid leave under the Act. If an employee is more than thirty (30) days late in paying the required portion of the health insurance premium, City may stop coverage. City shall be reimbursed by employee for employee's portion of premium advanced by City. City reserves all rights granted it by the Act, even if not specifically set forth above.

SEVERANCE PAY FOR APPOINTED OFFICIALS

The positions of City Administrator/Clerk/Treasurer and Chief of Police are appointed officials who serve at the pleasure of the Mayor pursuant to City Code and applicable law. In recognition of the at-will nature of these appointments and the potential for removal without cause due to administrative or political transitions, the following severance provisions shall apply:

Eligibility: This severance policy applies only to the City Administrator/Clerk/Treasurer and the Chief of Police.

Termination Without Just Cause: If either appointed official is removed or terminated without just cause, the individual shall be entitled to severance pay equivalent to up to three (3) months of the employee's base salary in effect at the time of termination.

Termination for Just Cause: No severance pay shall be provided in cases of termination for just cause, including but not limited to misconduct, gross negligence, malfeasance, or violation of city policy resulting in dismissal.

Release Agreement: Payment of severance shall be contingent upon execution of a mutual separation and release agreement between the City and the appointed official, waiving any further claims arising from the employment relationship or separation.

Payment Schedule:

Severance shall be paid in a lump sum within thirty (30) days of the effective termination date, unless an alternative payment arrangement is agreed upon by the Employee & City Council.

 - f. Customer, in writing, directs SEL to suspend performance of the Project.
- 2. If SEL suspends performance of the Project in accordance with this section, then:
 - a. SEL shall have no liability for any damages due to such suspension, including, but not limited to, delay damages;
 - b. The Parties shall, in writing, agree upon a revised schedule for SEL to perform the Project once the suspension ends;
 - Customer shall pay SEL for labor completed prior to the suspension, which shall be based
 on hours incurred and billed at the contracted rates or, if none stated, at current SEL billing
 rates;
 - d. Customer shall pay SEL for all materials procured prior to suspension for panels and products, if applicable, which shall be billed at contracted rates or, if none stated, at actual cost-plus fifteen percent (15%);

- e. Customer shall pay SEL for all other expenses incurred by SEL prior to the suspension, which shall be billed at the contracted rates or, if none stated, at actual cost-plus fifteen percent (15%);

3 Clarifications and Exceptions

SEL ES developed the scope of work, schedule, and price based on the information provided to us as listed in this proposal. Should additional or changed work be required, including such work resulting from unusual conditions or for any other reasons that are not evident from the information provided, changes to the price or schedule may result.

SEL ES will assign a project manager to the project. The project manager will oversee and maintain the schedule within SEL ES. The project manager will also be the point of contact with the Customer in order to maintain a smooth flow of information.

For safety reasons, SEL ES service personnel will not plan to work more than ten (10) hours per day. Should job requirements dictate work hours in excess of ten (10) hours per day, SEL ES and the Customer must review the requirements and agree on an appropriate plan that addresses safety concerns and the reasonableness of the hardship that the excessive hours place on SEL ES personnel.

3.1 Clarifications

SEL ES provides the following clarifications in a sincere effort to ensure we have a common understanding with our clients. It is not intended to deflect or reduce our commitment to serving the client. On the contrary it is meant to ensure we have a truly common understanding of our scope of supply. Please read the clarifications carefully. SEL ES remains open to working with the client to adjust, should there be a disconnect in our mutual understanding.

- 1. This proposal includes an FDS. The FDS will establish the design basis, equipment part numbers, and document-specific Customer requirements. As a part of this document, SEL ES will determine if additional equipment is needed to fulfil the requirements and may suggest value-engineered solutions. The FDS is a critical design document that must be finalized and approved by all responsible parties early in the design phase. The signed and approved FDS supersedes any proposal, specification, or other preliminary design documents. The programming and configuration of relays will not begin until after the standard FDS is approved by the Customer.
- 2. SEL ES will configure the RTAC to collect up to thirty (30) analog and thirty (30) digital tags per IED. It will also include controls (Open/Close breaker operation) for the applicable SEL relays.
- 3. No training is included in this proposal. The customer's preferred training type must be determined before it can be added to this proposal at additional cost.
- Commissioning schedule will be based on availability of staff at the time the outage dates are
 confirmed and locked in. Commissioning will not be scheduled on holidays, weekends, or outside
 standard dayshift work hours.
- 5. Unless otherwise stated above, the SEL ES commissioning scope of work considers testing of SEL equipment only.
- During onsite commissioning support, SEL ES engineers will work under the direction of the Customer's engineer and will assist with technical issues that arise during commissioning.
- 7. The Customer shall provide a senior electrician, or otherwise qualified person, to assist with commissioning activities on site. This would include:
 - a. Assistance with point-to-point testing to verify correctness of wiring
 - b. Assistance with wiring corrections if any errors are encountered

- 8. The Customer will perform all lock-out tag-out (LOTO) switching, grounding operations, and create all required switching orders and LOTO work permits.
- 9. SEL ES has allowed for normal commissioning planning and commissioning plan approval but has not allowed for extra onsite training. It is intended that site orientation will happen on the first visit and is included in the onsite commissioning time. Site-specific training will be provided by the Customer. Training in excess of four (4) hours shall be subject to additional charges covered under a change order.
- 10. The Customer will assist in obtaining all required information and act as the point of contact until all information is received and validated from all equipment vendors.
- 11. SEL ES will perform this project work based on the information and data provided by the Customer. Subsequent design revisions after SEL ES starts the project may require a change order for additional costs and may affect the final deliverables schedule.
- 12. If the Customer does not meet credit requirements, SEL ES will require a letter of credit, a bank guaranty, or a bond in the amount of the project value or prepayments for each milestone. This guaranty or bond will be at the Customer's expense and shall be valid for the life of the project. In the event an unpaid or past due amount exists at 30 days before the expiration of the guaranty or bond, then the Customer shall provide a replacement guaranty or bond prior to the expiration of the original guaranty or bond.
- 13. Hardware and settings development for non-SEL devices, including routers and gateways, are not included in the scope. SEL ES will provide communication parameters for the non-SEL devices to be programmed by third parties.
- 14. Time synchronization for non-SEL devices can be provided if these devices support IRIG-B or SNTP time signals.
- 15. The Customer will provide all protective element set points and/or the existing relay settings. Power system studies or relay coordination studies review are not included in this proposal. This can be provided as an additional service.
- 16. SEL ES assumes that the relay coordination and other protective set points for devices upstream and downstream of this project are correct. The verification of this data is not included in this scope of work.
- 17. The customer is responsible for running the IRIG-B cables and Multi-Mode Fiber Optic cables from the Control Room to the PDC, U9 Wartsila, and Wartsila SWGR, as indicated in the attached communication drawings. - No receipts will be provided as part of the per diem rates.
- The mobilization fee is defined to include the labor and travel costs associated with transporting one person roundtrip to and from the Customer's site.
- The daily rate is the charge per person, per day. Typical working hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Lunch shall be up to 60 minutes with two 15-minute breaks each day. If all the onsite work cannot be performed during typical working hours, then the daily per diem rate will be billed at 1.5 times the above rate for work performed Monday through Friday. Onsite work performed on Saturday, Sunday, or on a holiday shall be agreed upon between the Customer and SEL ES in advance and be subject to additional charges.
- Time spent by SEL ES personnel on site while waiting standby, training, or traveling to and from the site will be considered billable time.

3.3 On-Site Commissioning Services

SEL ES personnel performing onsite commissioning and testing support will:

- Adhere to both Customer- and SEL ES-required operational and safety processes and procedures. SEL ES personnel will execute safety expectations to the more rigorous of either the Customer or SEL ES safety requirements. The minimum SEL ES safety expectations include:
 - Use personal protective equipment (PPE), including Category 2 arc-rated (AR) flame-resistant (FR) clothing, safety glasses, ear plugs, hard hat, and safety toe protective footwear.

- Perform daily tailboard meetings. If site conditions change unexpectedly, a subsequent tailboard meeting shall be performed.
- Limit SEL ES employees' arc-flash energy exposure to 8 cal/cm² (see Note 1).
- Prohibit SEL ES employees from working with asbestos-containing material (see Note 2).
- Follow Customer notifications to SEL ES personnel concerning any special safety training, prior to onsite commissioning and testing activities (training time shall apply to onsite support time).
- Perform all work activities using the SEL human performance tools, as applicable. The SEL human performance tools will include, but are not limited to:
 - Stop-work authorization. Initiate a stop-work and/or time-out when conditions change or abnormal situations or discrepancies arise.
 - Three-part communications.
 - Flagging, taping, signage, and barriers.
 - Independent verifications and/or reviews of critical steps in the evolution of work.
 - Performance of place-keeping methods to maintain tracking of critical steps.
 - Performance of pre-job briefing and walkdown before working on active control schemes, including breaker failure, local and remote breaker backup, transfer trip schemes, remedial action scheme activation, etc.
- Participate in and execute energy control processes as required by the Customer and as stipulated in the SEL ES commissioning procedures. The minimum energy control expectations include:
 - Development of an SEL ES-written testing and commissioning plan, according to the scope of this proposal.
 - Review and perform a walkdown inspection of applicable energy control boundaries (lockout/tagout [LOTO]). Verify the installation and/or closure of any installed safety grounds and/or switches and open points. Ensure that tagging is in place and/or controlled by the Customer's designated authority (dispatch) (see Note 3).
 - Sign on to the Customer's clearance order or permitting processes and subsequent release from clearance when the work evolution ends.
- Provide site leadership, direction, and Customer collaboration and communications during the
 job-site work execution, equipment testing, wiring verifications, and equipment energizing. The
 site leadership will encompass the following:
 - Verification and/or validity of "Issue for Construction" engineering documentation.
 - Technical supervision of crews performing demolition and wiring activities.
 - Management of sequencing of testing activities according to the preapproved testing and commissioning plan.
 - Performance of wire checks and circuit verifications.
 - Execution of primary current injection testing.
 - Execution of secondary current injection testing.
 - Management of the energization and testing of control schemes and protective relays.

- Performance of the verification of settings and configuration files.
- Preparation of documentation of commissioning events.
- Communication of regular/daily Customer updates regarding the site status and/or progress and the equipment configuration.
- Assumption of responsibility for all work activities performed under the SEL ES scope of
 this proposal. Unexpected outcomes including equipment issues, product defects, and safety
 or human performance issues will immediately initiate a stop-work time-out and the
 Customer and SEL ES leadership must be engaged.
- Responsibility to provide Customer support for emergent or emergency situations not directly associated under the SEL ES scope of this contract.

If an emergent or emergency situation arises with the Customer's equipment (e.g., load at risk or load lost), and Customer assistance is needed, SEL ES personnel will assist and/or advise the Customer with respect to the remediation of the emergent or emergency situation without a preapproved testing plan. During the emergent or emergency situation, SEL ES personnel will work under the direction of the Customer and will be available in a technical support role only.

Note 1: Electrical outages (controlled through LOTO or other clearance processes) should be considered to eliminate risk of employee exposure to arc-flash incident energy. If the normal incident energy is above 8 cal/cm², SEL ES will work with the Customer to evaluate the options to reduce fault current and fault current clearing times, including creating temporary settings changes to speed up protection, opening tie breakers, and other incident energy reduction techniques. If an arc-flash study is required to determine the incident energy level, SEL ES will provide a proposal to do this work under a separate contract.

Note 2: SEL ES employees will not perform any work activities on asbestos-containing material or presumed asbestos-containing material within the work zone that will be disturbed during normal work activities or material that is already in a friable state, until a negative test result is received from a certified laboratory verifying the absence of asbestos in the workplace. If a positive result is confirmed indicating that any hazardous material is present, no work activities shall commence or resume without complete remediation by qualified contractors. It will be the responsibility of the equipment and/or asset owner to mitigate any identified and verified asbestos hazards.

Note 3: SEL ES personnel do not provide services for switching of the Customer's primary equipment to establish LOTO and/or clearance orders. The Customer must provide qualified personnel for switching primary equipment to establish primary LOTO and/or clearance zones for commissioning and testing activities.

3.4 Relay Setting Service

Relay settings will be selected to maintain coordination, to the extent that it is practical to do so. If system coordination cannot be maintained, SEL ES will work with the Customer to determine the best course of action. Any fault study developed or performed will be limited to that as defined under Section 1: Scope of Services. Adjacent substations and equivalent systems within one line segment of the study area will be included to verify coordination. All pertinent fault and relay data are to be provided by the Customer in a timely manner. Remote substation relay settings, evaluation, and recommendations are beyond the scope of this project.

Relay settings and supporting documentation are provided by electronic means. The documents include relay settings, supporting calculations, pertinent fault study results, and overcurrent coordination curves, as required in Microsoft Word or Adobe Acrobat format. In addition, these documents will also include settings for all SEL relays in an ACSELERATOR QuickSet® SEL-5030 Software database to facilitate setting the relays.

3.5 Cyber Security - Project Passwords

To maintain security during the processes of engineering, fabrication, factory tests, shipment, delivery, onsite testing, and commissioning, the electronic devices in this system are assigned project passwords. They are specific to this project and are controlled at SEL ES on a strict need-to-know basis.

As part of the final deliverables from SEL ES, the Customer will receive documentation identifying the project passwords in each of the delivered products. SEL ES recommends that the Customer change the project passwords to Customer-defined passwords upon receipt of their products.

SEL ES policy is to change passwords; however, SEL ES will follow the Customer policy regarding passwords as advised.

3.6 Expense Overhead

3.6.1 Test Equipment

The following test equipment will be billed at the rate of \$450 per day for bench testing and/or Customer-witnessed testing at an SEL ES facility or for any testing performed at the Customer's site. 4.1.1 SEL Human Performance

SEL ES project procedures are designed to highlight human performance improvement (HPI) error precursors and implement tools to place barriers against hazards encountered in engineering work and in the field. HPI tools that are built into the daily work of SEL ES engineers include, but are not limited to:

- Peer-check requirements
- Questioning attitude
- Stop work
- Policy adherence
- Effective communication strategies
- Documentation of good catches and near misses
- Participation in surveys and questionnaires to obtain feedback

4.1.2 Qualified Electrical Worker Training

Employees shall complete SEL Qualified Electrical Worker (SQEW) training to work in the field. The two-day course is comprised of section competencies measured through quizzes. The second day, employees collaborate, respond to real-life scenarios encountered in the field, and teach the class their evaluation. SQEW training covers:

- National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 70E[®]
- Shock and arc-flash hazards and approach boundaries
- Risk assessment
- HPI tools and applications
- PPE in accordance with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and NFPA 70E
- Substation equipment, entry, and protocols
- Step and touch potential
- Control of hazardous energy (LOTO)
- Electrically safe work conditions
- Situational awareness

4.1.3 SEL Field Safety Manual Training

The scope includes all SEL employees who visit Customers' sites to perform work in which the job may expose them to physical, mechanical, electrical, chemical, or radiological hazards. SEL ES complies with all local, state, and federal laws, as well as with other regulations relative to the methods of performing work. The contents meet or exceed the requirements of OSHA regulations and NFPA 70E.

4.1.4 Commissioning Qualification

Commissioning personnel are qualified within their area of expertise (i.e., automation, protection) and progress with greater levels of authority based on hands-on performance, demonstration of knowledge in each competency, and by final qualification via a review panel process and supervisory evaluation.

4.1.5 Event Reporting and Investigation

SEL ES has a robust event reporting and investigation program to collect safety data from employees when hazards or potential hazards are encountered while working. The goal is to proactively educate employees, create awareness, and put barriers against hazards in place to improve safety performance. A communication program provides information to employees regarding the good catch/near miss and allows discussion as to why they are important to safety performance.

5 Project Quality Plan

SEL maintains a documented quality system that meets the requirements of ISO 9001.

SEL ES strives to design, develop, and deliver dependable, quality solutions that exceed Customer expectations by applying the example SEL ES Project Procedure illustrated in Figure 1. The procedure and subordinate work instructions encompass a sequential, phase-gate design process that is tailored to the specific scope of the project. The primary goal is to design in quality from the beginning of the project. Time spent early on to ensure that the Customer's project requirements and the design basis are correct saves time and effort in later phases for the Customer, the project team, and others involved.

The SEL ES Project Procedure for a typical project has phases for planning, definition, development, testing/validation, commissioning, and close out. Detailed design reviews of requirements and deliverables by competent technical reviewers from SEL ES authorized reviewer lists ensure the quality of deliverables. Testing and validation processes prove the performance of the solution for the Customer's application.

The Customer has an important role in the process. Throughout the project, SEL ES will communicate project status and provide opportunities to define requirements, review deliverables, and provide feedback on SEL ES performance. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

Between the City of Falls City and Falls City Special Olympics

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into this ___ day of ______, 20___, by and between the City of Falls City, Nebraska (hereinafter referred to as "the City"), and Falls City Special Olympics (hereinafter referred to as "Special Olympics"), an organization that provides year-round sports training and athletic competition for children and adults with intellectual disabilities.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to define the relationship between the City and Special Olympics regarding the use of Prichard Auditorium and to clarify roles and responsibilities from each entity. This agreement ensures fair access and use for organized practices and competitions while maintaining public access to Prichard Auditorium.

II. Scope

A. Covered Facilities

This agreement applies to the following City-owned or City-managed facilities:

1. Prichard Auditorium

The City may amend this list with written notice and mutual agreement of both parties.

III. Roles and Responsibilities

A. City of Falls City

- Designates the Parks and Recreation Director as the primary point of contact.
- Maintains facility condition and performs major repairs/capital improvements.
- Blackouts dates for Special Olympics based on timely schedules.
- May suspend facility access due to misuse or violations.

B. Falls City Special Olympics

- Coordinates facility needs and scheduling dates at least 30 days in advance.
- Uses facilities at no cost, subject to policies.
- Maintains cleanliness and reports damage.
- Maintains liability insurance and submits annually.

IV. Facility Use Prioritization and Public Access

- Special Olympics and other recognized entities with MOUs receive priority access if scheduled timely.
- Facility is otherwise first-come, first-served unless reserved by public.
- Public rentals subject to rental fees set by resolution.
- City may update rental policies without affecting priority status for Special Olympics.

V. Term and Termination

1. Term

This MOU shall remain in effect indefinitely from the date of execution and shall continue year-to-year unless terminated in accordance with the provisions below. The agreement is intended to support a long-term partnership without the need for annual renewal, unless otherwise agreed by the parties.

2. Termination

Either party may terminate this MOU by providing at least sixty (60) days' written notice to the other party. Prior to termination, both parties agree to make a good faith effort to address and resolve any concerns or disputes.

VI. Liability

Special Olympics shall indemnify and hold harmless the City of Falls City, its officers, agents, and employees from any claims, demands, or liabilities arising from its operations or activities under this MOU. The City assumes no liability for injuries or damages related to Special Olympics' programs or participants.

Administrative Directions

Nebraska Rural Generation, LLC ("NRG") is conducting preliminary feasibility work for a potential large-scale industrial and energy development project located in or near Falls City. To support this early-stage evaluation, the City and NRG previously executed a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) governing the exchange of confidential information related to feasibility, engineering, and conceptual project planning.

A proposed Community Benefits Agreement ("CBA") has been provided for review. The CBA outlines shared commitments regarding local hiring, workforce training, apprenticeship opportunities, supplier diversity, educational partnerships, community engagement, and public reporting. The CBA is designed as a publicly facing document expressing core values and community benefits associated with potential project development. It does not impose any financial or infrastructure obligations upon the City and does not replace or supersede future formal development agreements.

As NRG proceeds with feasibility studies for utilities, land planning, transportation corridors, and environmental assessments both city administrative and departmental coordination may be required to answer operational questions, provide publicly available data, support logistical planning, and facilitate communication between City departments and NRG's technical team. These activities do not obligate the City to financial commitments or project approvals.

A future Development Agreement will ultimately govern land use, infrastructure, regulatory processes, commitments by the City, and any financial or operational responsibilities. This future agreement will be separately negotiated, reviewed, and considered by the City Council before any action is taken.

City management staff recommends approval of the Resolution authorizing execution of the Community Benefits Agreement, directing administrative support for feasibility coordination, and authorizing the initiation of Development Agreement negotiations.

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AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A COMMUNITY BENEFITS AGREEMENT WITH NEBRASKA RURAL GENERATION (NRG), DIRECTING CITY ADMINISTRATION TO PROVIDE COORDINATION SUPPORT FOR FEASIBILITY STUDIES, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO NEGOTIATIONS FOR A FUTURE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT.

Whereas, Nebraska Rural Generation, LLC ("NRG") is undertaking preliminary feasibility analysis for a potential industrial and energy development project in Falls City, Nebraska; and

Whereas, NRG has prepared a proposed Community Benefits Agreement ("CBA") setting forth shared commitments regarding local hiring, workforce development, supplier diversity, educational partnerships, and community engagement, as reflected in the draft presented to the City Council; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that execution of the CBA will promote transparency, community involvement, and equitable growth opportunities associated with the prospective project; and

Whereas, the City previously entered into a non-disclosure agreement with NRG governing confidential feasibility work, and the City Council recognizes that NRG's ongoing feasibility studies may require coordinated logistical support, data sharing, and administrative engagement from City departments; and

Whereas, any future Development Agreement between the City, FCU, and NRG will be subject to separate negotiation, City Council review, and formal approval, and nothing in this Resolution or the CBA constitutes a commitment by the City to provide financial incentives, regulatory approvals, land use decisions, or infrastructure contributions; and

Whereas, the City Council desires to authorize City administration to begin preliminary negotiations toward such a Development Agreement, consistent with established City policies and subject to future Council authorization.

Therefore, be it resolved by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Falls City, NE, that:

- The Mayor, City Administrator, and/or authorized City representatives are hereby authorized to
 execute the Community Benefits Agreement between Nebraska Rural Generation, LLC and
 Falls City Utilities, in substantially the form presented, with such minor amendments as may be
 deemed necessary and in the best interest of the City, subject to approval by the City Attorney
 as to form.
- 2. City administration and department leadership are authorized and directed to provide reasonable coordination, information sharing, and logistical support necessary for NRG's ongoing feasibility studies, including but not limited to utilities, transportation, land use, permitting processes, and access to publicly available municipal data provided that such support does not obligate the City to any financial expenditure, infrastructure commitment, or contractual obligation not expressly approved by the City Council.

- 3. The City Administrator and/or Utility Superintendent are authorized to initiate preliminary negotiations with NRG for a future Development Agreement. Any proposed Development Agreement shall be brought back to the City Council for full review, discussion, and approval prior to execution.
- 4. Nothing in this Resolution or the CBA shall be construed as approval of any land use action, financial incentive, utility commitment, infrastructure provision, zoning decision, or other governmental approval. All such actions, if proposed, shall require separate and formal consideration by the City Council.

Community Benefits Agreement (CBA)

Between

Nebraska Rural Generation LLC (NRG)

And

Falls City Utilities (FCU)

Effective Date: December 1, 2025

1. Purpose

This Community Benefits Agreement ("Agreement") establishes a framework for collaboration between Nebraska Rural Generation LLC ("NRG") and Falls City Utilities ("FCU") to ensure that the development, construction, and operation of the new power generation and industrial facilities in Falls City, Nebraska deliver measurable economic and social benefits to the local community.

2. Guiding Principles

The Parties share a mutual commitment to promote equitable economic growth in Falls City and Richardson County; create sustainable local employment opportunities; enhance workforce skills through targeted training and apprenticeship programs; increase participation of local and diverse suppliers in procurement and contracting; and support long-term community prosperity.

3. Local Hiring Commitments

- At least 40% of total construction labor hours will be performed by residents of Falls City and Richardson County.
- At least 25% of operational staff positions at the facility will be filled by local residents within three (3) years of operation.
- NRG and FCU shall prioritize hiring from local unions, workforce development boards, and technical colleges.
- Job postings shall be publicly advertised through local channels including the City of Falls
 City website, local newspapers, and community bulletin boards.
- Quarterly reports will be submitted to the City Council and community stakeholders summarizing local hiring progress and outcomes.

4. Supplier Diversity and Local Procurement

- A minimum of 20% of total construction and operational contracts will be awarded to qualified local businesses within Falls City's 68355 zip code.
- NRG and FCU will host at least two annual supplier outreach events.
- A "Local Supplier Registry" will be developed to track participation and capacity-building needs.

 NRG will partner with FCU to offer technical assistance programs to help local suppliers meet project qualification standards, safety compliance, and bid requirements.

5. Workforce Training and Education

- NRG and FCU will collaborate with local institutions such as Southeast Community College and Falls City High School to design training for energy, construction, and maintenance trades.
- A formal Apprenticeship Program will be established, targeting at least 30 apprentices during construction and 10 ongoing apprenticeships during operations.
- NRG will contribute an annual \$50,000 Community Scholarship Fund to support students pursuing education in engineering, renewable energy, and skilled trades.

6. Community Engagement and Transparency

- A Community Advisory Committee (CAC) shall be established with representatives from NRG, FCU, the City of Falls City, and local community organizations.
- An annual public report shall summarize hiring data, supplier diversity outcomes, training participation, and community investments.
- At least one community meeting will be held annually to provide updates, receive feedback, and discuss future opportunities.

7. Term and Review

This Agreement shall remain in effect for ten (10) years, renewable upon mutual consent. Annual reviews will be conducted to evaluate performance and adjust targets as necessary. Either Party may propose amendments in writing subject to mutual agreement.
